Garry is an invited presenter at the 2018 World Summit on Positive Psychology, mindfulness & Psychotherapy. His latest book "School Crisis Prevention & Intervention" is a best seller in the USA. He is the clinical advisor on the Queensland Board of The Fathering Project.
